Going the Distance: Officers Across the State Join Project Extra Mile to Learn About Alcohol Compliance Check Operations

On April 14-15, participants from 18 Central & Western Nebraska law enforcement agencies and coalitions gathered in North Platte and Grand Island to learn more about the importance of alcohol retail compliance checks and how to collaborate to conduct these operations. Retired Special Agent Nancy McGee shared how to effectively conduct operations from building community support to properly gathering evidence so the clerks and businesses can be successfully prosecuted. Project Extra Mile shared information on how coalitions can provide administrative support for these operations and send a clear message to businesses and the community that these operations are critical for preventing underage drinking tragedies.
